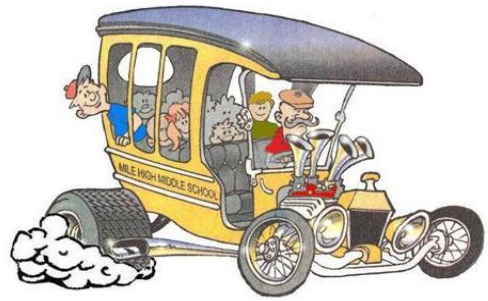

JOHN & PAM'S TRIP TO VISIT INDIAN RUINS

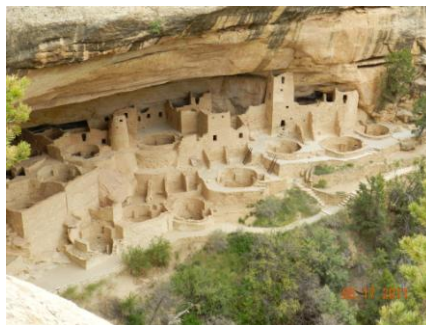
